Structure & Available Subjects:	<p>A major in linguistics and applied linguistics usually consists of eight 12.5 subjects, totalling 100 points. It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # one first-year subject in linguistics and applied linguistics (12.5 points). The Secret Life of Language is the recommended first-year subject. Students may enrol in more than one first-year subject if they wish; and # seven second/third-year subjects in linguistics and applied linguistics including at least five core subjects. <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
