Objectives:	On completion of this subject, students should be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Demonstrate an understanding of language and literacy acquisition by school-aged children with language delay/disorder or hearing loss; # Demonstrate an advanced understanding of issues associated with assessment of communication, language, and literacy; # Demonstrate an ability to analyse, problem solve and interpret results from different assessments for students with language delay/disorder or hearing loss # Demonstrate an ability to plan individualized communication, speech, language, and literacy programs. # Evaluate a child's communication, language, and literacy competence; # Use of a range of different assessment tools; # Collect and analyse communication, language and literacy samples; # Problem-solve communication, language and literacy issues
