Subject Overview:	This subject develops from the first semester subject, dealing with more advanced modes of critical interpretation of the visual arts, past and present.						
Objectives:	This subject will enable students to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to gain a clear, basic knowledge and understanding of certain key historical moments and works of art and their contexts; • to become familiar with terminology used in the critical understanding of art at a tertiary level; • to understand methods of study appropriate at a tertiary level. 						
Assessment:	1. Textual criticism exercise in short essay format (25%). Length 1000 words. Due Week 62. Tutorial presentation with written submission (25%). Length 1000 words. Due one week after class presentation 3. Essay (50%). Length 2000 words. Due Week 13 Hurdle requirements: Students must attend 80% of all scheduled classes and attempt all elements of assessment to be eligible for a pass in this subject.
