<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This subject enables performers singers to develop further their skills in relation to movement on stage and general presentation in performance.
<b>Objectives:</b>	Upon completion of this subject students should be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have an understanding and a good ability to use intention based- action playing.</li> <li>• Use specific motivational techniques where necessary.</li> <li>• Have confidence in spoken dialogue, whether in a libretto or on the concert platform.</li> <li>• Modify their performance for different situations i.e., for audition, competition, concert platform or staged production.</li> <li>• Move freely and convincingly around the stage when required.</li> <li>• Understand and take physical direction from a director or theatre practitioner.</li> <li>• Maintain a motivated and engaging performance standard whilst occupied with several artistic tasks on stage.</li> <li>• To utilise specific tools to keep developing the art of convincing an audience that the performance is spontaneous and happening in the moment.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	Continuous: Preparation and commitment as demonstrated by performance tasks and/or a regularly updated journal of activities embracing all areas studied (50%) - Hurdle requirement 80% attendance. Formal: One performance/demonstration of approximately 15 minutes duration (50%).
