Objectives:	<p>This program will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -place its primary emphasis on training mid-career journalists who want to build on their existing skills and knowledge; -reflect on professional issues they face, and develop new and innovative forms of practice; -link theory and practice in a way that has not been achieved in graduate programs at other universities; -explore the issues that will shape the world of the 21 st Century and to equip students with the knowledge and skills to be successful in that world; -take a real-world profession-based approach to delivery, through the use of case-based teaching and the production of high quality journalism by students; -use flexible delivery modes including intensives and after-hours contact so as to ensure that the program is accessible to working students.
