This subject introduces the concepts, technologies and standards underpinning the World Wide Web and its applications. You will learn to apply tools and techniques required to design and develop applications for the Web. Topics covered include the infrastructure of the Web; the architecture of Web applications; data representation on the Web; the structure of the Web; Web development processes; multimedia, security and social aspects of the Web.</p>
