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Entry Requirements:	<p>Minimum entry requirement</p> <p>100 point program:</p> <p>A four year honours degree or equivalent, in a cognate discipline, with an average of H2B (70%) or above;</p> <p>or</p> <p>A three-year undergraduate degree or equivalent, in a cognate discipline, with an average of H2B (70%) or above, and at least 2 years of documented, relevant work experience;</p> <p>or</p> <p>an undergraduate degree and graduate certificate in an appropriate discipline, with an average of H2B (70%) or above and at least two years of documented relevant work experience.</p> <p>200 point program:</p> <p>A three-year undergraduate degree or equivalent, with an average of H2B (70%) or above.</p> <p>The Selection Committee may conduct interviews or tests and may call for referee reports and employer references to elucidate any of the matters referred to above.</p>
