<b>Subject Overview:</b>	<p>This subject provides an overview of key elements of institutional research in tertiary education, to provide participants with knowledge and insights in areas such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># the foundations of institutional research: its history, emergence as a profession, contexts of application, and the role it plays in institutional governance and management</li> <li># international developments, concepts and approaches: the emergence of benchmarks and rankings and the use of institutional classifications</li> <li># analytic resources: common tools, techniques and technologies</li> <li># common domains of analysis: student enrolments, progression and completion, programs of study, research activity, workforce planning.</li> </ul>						
<b>Objectives:</b>	<p>On completion, participants should be able to apply what they have learned, for example by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># describing the role of institutional research in tertiary education policy, planning and practice</li> <li># using institutional research to support management and leadership activities</li> <li># analysing trends and making projections for planning purposes in areas such as student demand, supply of staff, resource requirements and information needs.</li> </ul>						
<b>Assessment:</b>	<p>There is one assessment task: A 3000-word written assignment due at end of subject (100%) There are two hurdle requirements: Four online Discussion Board tasks ( 4 x 500-word commentaries on set readings) due every 2 weeks. For any discussion board task submitted late, the task increases to a 1000 word commentary. Participate in 3 online webinars due every 2-3 weeks. For any webinar missed, students must write and post on the discussion board a 1000 word topic summary, drawing on the recorded webinar and related discussion board postings. NB: All hurdle and assessment tasks must be passed</p>
