It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># two first year subjects: ANTH10001 Anthropology Studying Human Diversity, and either an <b>Arts Foundation Subject</b> (<a href="https://handbook.unimelb.edu.au/.../view/current/%21B-ARTS-SPC%2B1001">.../view/current/%21B-ARTS-SPC%2B1001</a>) or DEVT10001 The Developing World; and</li> <li># three second/third year level subjects selected from the core subjects list; and</li> <li># three second/third year level subjects from either the core or optional lists.</li> </ul> <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
