Structure & Available Subjects:	<p>Students undertaking pure honours in Chinese must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Chinese Thesis (50 points); # Critical Asian Perspectives (12.5 points); # Honours Chinese A (12.5 points); # Honours Chinese B (12.5 points); and # 12.5 points of elective subjects selected from: Topics in Chinese Studies, Supervised Reading (Asia Institute), Education and State Power in China, or Globalisation and China. <p>Students undertaking combined honours in Chinese must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Chinese Thesis (50 points); # Critical Asian Perspectives (12.5 points); # Three subjects in the combining discipline (37.5 points). <p>Or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Honours thesis in the combining discipline (50 points); # One subjects in the combining discipline (12.5 points); and # Three subjects in Chinese (37.5 points). <p>Total 100 points</p>
