Structure & Available Subjects:	<p>Students undertaking pure honours in philosophy must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # PHIL40019 Philosophy Thesis (37.5 points); and # PHIL40020 Reading and Writing Philosophy (12.5 points); and # Four honours subjects (seminars) in philosophy (50 points). <p>Students undertaking combined honours in philosophy and another program must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # PHIL40019 Philosophy Thesis (37.5 points); and # PHIL40020 Reading and Writing Philosophy (12.5 points); and # Two honours subjects in philosophy (25 points); and # Two honours subjects in the combining discipline (25 points). <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Honours thesis in the combining discipline (50 points); and # One honours subject in the combining discipline (12.5 points); and # Three honours subjects in philosophy (37.5 points). <p>Total 100 points</p>
