Learning Outcomes:	<p>Students who complete the Graduate Diploma should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Demonstrate an independent approach to knowledge that uses rigorous methods of inquiry and appropriate theories and methodologies that are applied with intellectual honesty and a respect for ethical values; # Apply critical and analytical skills and methods to the identification and resolution of problems; # Act as informed and critically discriminating participants within the community of scholars, as citizens and in the work force; # Communicate effectively; # Commit to continuous learning; # Be proficient in the use of appropriate modern technologies, such as the computer and other information technology systems, for the acquisition, processing and interpretation of data. <p>-</p> <p>Core participation requirements: Fieldwork, practicals and laboratory experiments</p> <p>This discipline requires all students to actively, independently and safely participate in all practical classes, utilising a range of observational, communication, motor, intellectual, and behavioural and social skills. Visual acuity, muscle coordination and balance are essential for participation. Students are also required to undertake experiments including specimen and microscope work with assessment reliant on careful observation and visual interpretation of results. Practical may also involve handling and working with animals.</p>
