<b>Subject Overview:</b>	<p>This subject was formerly called Research Project E (Masters).</p> <p>Students will plan and carry out an independent research project on a topic of relevance to their degree course. The project will involve a critical review of the relevant literature, setting the objectives of the study, selecting an appropriate theoretical framework and research method, specifying the research questions, collecting and analysing data, and reporting results in a coherent document. Students must enrol in this subject twice for a total of 25 points over two consecutive semesters as it comprises one half of a full-year research project.</p> <p>*Note: This subject is a 25-point subject. Students must enrol in this subject twice over two consecutive semesters.</p>
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>At the conclusion of this subject students will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Identify and develop an appropriate research topic and refine research questions and hypotheses</li> <li># Critically analyse the literature in this field</li> <li># Identify and apply appropriate research methods</li> <li># Synthesise and communicate research findings in both written and graphic format.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	A literature review (due at the end of the first semester of enrolment - hurdle requirement only, not graded). A minor thesis of not more than 10,000 words - 100% (due at the end of the second semester of enrolment).
