The student will be expected to engage with and actively participate in a variety of clinical experiences, assessing and managing a range of communication/swallowing disorders for infants, children, young people and adults. This provides the opportunity for the student to develop their own personal growth and identity as a speech pathologist. Students will independently select and implement relevant diagnostic procedures and will plan and implement methods for the reduction of communication and/or swallowing difficulties during these clinical placements.
