<b>Subject Overview:</b>	The subject will critically examine how cultural organisations use documentation to archive their collections, promote cultural conservation and reveal context. Students will develop an interdisciplinary understanding and approach to the documentation of cultural material conservation in the arts and culture sector. This includes installation and display solutions for museums and cultural sites.  During the pre-teaching period students are expected to complete the course readings, review the lectures and any other course preparation as outlined on the LMS. The LMS will become available at the commencement of the pre-teaching dates.
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b>	In this subject students will: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Apply an interdisciplinary understanding and approach to conserve the histories surrounding objects using new media.</li> <li># Use a range of media tools to build production pathways for documenting, editing, displaying and archiving cultural forms and process.</li> <li># Review ideas and programs generated by non-governmental organisations, community-based art centres and businesses promoting cultural heritage practice.</li> </ul>

Demonstrate a sound knowledge and understanding of the documentation principles, methodologies and best practice standards</li> <li># Apply critical and analytical skills and methods, to the identification and resolution of how new technology is used to promote increased public engagement and participation.</li> <li># Operate production equipment including video cameras, audio recording equipment, mobile devices, screen technology</li> </ul>
