Teaching practice incorporates appropriate presentation and practice of the target language, both spoken and written; the design, implementation and evaluation of lessons and units of work for students at a variety of language levels, the adaptation of existing materials and development of original work to meet student needs and interests; the assessment and reporting of students' language development; the establishment of collaborative relationships with other staff members and the wider school community and self-reflection and critical evaluation of one's own practice. This subject has a TESOL or Modern Languages/LOTE focus, according to the course within which the student is enrolled.

This lesson plan will be for a lesson the student has taught on placement, and will identify the linguistic goals of the lesson, and learning activities that lead to the achievement of these goals. Posting an electronic response to a peer's lesson plan via email to their peer partner and a copy to the subject coordinator of 150 to 200 words, which provides comment on what the student sees as strengths of the lesson plan and which comments on ways in which the plan is similar or different to lesson plans written by the responding student in their teaching placement.
