<b>Subject Overview:</b>	<p>This subject provides an overview of key elements of managing international tertiary education, to provide participants with knowledge and insights in areas such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># international context and trends in cross-border tertiary education</li> <li># government policies and market settings for cross-border study</li> <li># institutional policies and strategies for attracting international students</li> <li># institutional policies and strategies for offering programs in other countries</li> <li># working with cross-cultural issues and student diversity in class and on campus</li> <li># ensuring quality and standards for both domestic and cross-border study.</li> </ul>						
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>On completion, participants should be able to apply what they have learned, for example by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># assessing the impact of a change in government policy affecting international student mobility</li> <li># assessing plans to attract international students to a particular institution or program</li> <li># developing a policy or program to improve cross-cultural skills for students</li> <li># integrating international perspectives in institutional policy, strategy and partnerships.</li> </ul>						
<b>Assessment:</b>	<p>There is one assessment task: A 3000-word written assignment, due at end of subject (100%)</p> <p>There are two hurdle requirements: Four online Discussion Board tasks ( 4 x 500-word commentaries on set readings) due every 2 weeks. For any discussion board task submitted late, the task increases to a 1000 word commentary. Participate in 3 online webinars, due every 2-3 weeks. For any webinar missed, students must write and post on the discussion board</p>						

	a 1000 word topic summary, drawing on the recorded webinar and related discussion board postings. NB All hurdle and assessment tasks must be passed.
<b>Prescribed Texts:</b>	Set readings are provided online before the subject commences.
