<b>Structure &amp; Available Subjects:</b>	<p>A major in criminology usually consists of eight 12.5-point subjects, totalling 100 points. It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># two first-year subjects in criminology (25 points); and</li> <li># three second-year subjects in criminology (37.5 points), including the compulsory subject MULT20003 Critical Analytical Skills; and</li> <li># three third-year subjects (37.5 points).</li> </ul> <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
