The Master of Architecture (by Design) is intended for people who are already qualified in architecture and who wish to pursue research in the field using design as a tool through which to explore a particular research problem. |

| Course Structure & Available Subjects: | Candidates undertake a coursework component for one semester in conjunction with the MArch (by coursework). However, any coursework undertaken may be equivalent to no more than one-third of the total assessment weight of the Masters degree. The remaining period of candidature will be devoted to the production of the major portfolio and dissertation. |
| Entry Requirements: | Applicants are required to have a five-year undergraduate or higher degree in architecture with a minimum average of H2B(70%) in their final year. Applicants should also have at least one years practical experience and as an architect. Applicants are required to submit a folio of recent work. |
