Topics will include: family-centred practice; working with culturally and linguistically diverse communities; ethics of professional engagement; indigenous education; leadership and management in the early childhood field; pedagogical leadership; teamwork and team-building; report writing responsibilities; available services and referral to them; advocacy.
