In order to be considered for entry, applicants must have completed:           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• either               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– an undergraduate degree in medicine, an allied health profession, science or social science, and two years of documented relevant work experience, or</li> <li>– at least five years of documented relevant professional work experience which demonstrates the capacity to undertake the course successfully.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>           Meeting these requirements does not guarantee selection.         </li> <li>2. In ranking and/or assessing applications, the Selection Committee will consider:           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• prior academic qualification and performance; and/or</li> <li>• the professional experience.</li> </ul> </li> <li>3. The Selection Committee may seek further information to clarify any aspect of an application in accordance with the <b>Student Application and Selection Procedure (<a href="https://policy.unimelb.edu.au/MPF1034">https://policy.unimelb.edu.au/MPF1034</a>)</b> .</li> <li>4. Applicants are required to satisfy the university's English language requirements for postgraduate courses. For those applicants seeking to meet these requirements by one of the standard tests approved by the Academic Board, performance <b>band 6.5 (<a href="http://about.unimelb.edu.au/academicboard/resolutions">http://about.unimelb.edu.au/academicboard/resolutions</a>)</b> is required.</li> </ol>
