In order to be considered for entry, applicants must have completed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• either <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– an undergraduate degree and a one year teaching qualification or equivalent, or</li> <li>– a four year teaching qualification or equivalent, or</li> <li>– an undergraduate degree or graduate diploma in a social or human science discipline, or</li> <li>– an undergraduate degree in an appropriate discipline or an equivalent qualification, and at least two years of documented work experience in Literacy Education.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> Meeting these requirements does not guarantee selection. </li> <li>2. In ranking applications, the Selection Committee will consider: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• prior academic performance; and if relevant</li> <li>• the professional experience.</li> </ul> </li> <li>3.
