Learning Outcomes:	The student will have acquired additional information, methodology or skills directly relevant to their program of study.
Assessment:	Seminar participation including class papers (1,000 words), due throughout the teaching period (20%) Applied practical project, resulting in brief report and reflective essay (3,000 words), due throughout the teaching period (30%) Final assignment (4,000 words), due within six weeks of module completion (50%)
