It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># up to two first-year subjects in philosophy (25 points); and</li> <li># second/third-year subjects in philosophy to total 100 points overall.</li> </ul> <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
