Overview:	The Graduate Diploma in Arts (Advanced) allows you to undertake a minor research subject and coursework subjects in a specialist field of study at an advanced level. This course is equivalent to an Arts Honours program if the thesis component is taken. It serves as prerequisite entry to a Masters by Research or PhD for those who have not completed a four-year Arts (Honours) degree in the relevant area.																	
Learning Outcomes:	<p>Students who complete the Graduate Diploma in Arts (Advanced) in this area of specialisation should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # have a rounded knowledge of criminological theory regarding the nature of crime and its control; # acquire skills in research procedures for the analysis of criminological issues, including the ability to plan and organise research; # gain an understanding of major elements of public policy debates relating to crime and its control, especially as these impact upon various parts of the criminal justice system; # develop an overview of the emerging alternatives posed for organising various aspects of the criminal justice system; and # receive instruction and advice, and have experience, in writing a preparatory research thesis on a criminological topic.
