Course Overview:	<p>The Bachelor of Fine Arts is a new three-year degree which offers immersive and experiential practice-based studio studies in seven areas of specialisation (Visual Art, Film and Television, Contemporary Music, Music Theatre, Theatre Practice, Dance and Production). It features an intense and student-centred approach to skills training, to create self-confident and autonomous arts practitioners with the capacity to build sustainable careers in an international context. Each specialisation features regular opportunities for exhibition, production and performance, and culminates in a capstone experience, which prepares students for professional work and further research. Critical studies build knowledge of the context of a student's core discipline along with academic literacy, and complementary studies offer a choice of electives in the visual and performing arts, or from other areas of study within the University of Melbourne. The degree is designed to have international currency and to assist the VCA to raise its international profile.</p>								
Learning Outcomes:	<p>The BFA is designed to train highly skilled arts practitioners who can work independently or in ensemble in a wide range of careers and performance or production opportunities. They will be well-trained and knowledgeable in their own and related fields, and committed to continuous learning and production in their discipline; they will also have a local and international perspective on their own arts practice. As well as excellence in practising their own art form, BFA graduates will have good academic literacy skills in expression, argument and research and be proficient in the use of appropriate modern technologies.</p>								
Course Structure & Available Subjects:	The course structure for the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Production) is outlined below:								
Majors/Minors/ Specialisations	<p>Students are selected into their major study as part of the interview process. The majors are Design Realisation, Stage Management and Performance Technology. First semester is an integrated study of production processes for all students. Semester 2 students progress to their chosen major and will not be able to change majors as the study in the majors is sequential. Semester 4 and 5 builds the student's skill base and enables them to explore different areas within their major. Semester 5 and 6 continues extending their skill base preparing them for their graduating projects and enables them to complete an industry internship.</p>

 - # performance in an audition, test, interview, workshop, portfolio or folio presentation.
- The Selection Committee may conduct interviews and tests and may call for referee reports or employer references to elucidate any of the matters referred to above.
