In order to be considered for entry, applicants must have completed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an undergraduate degree or equivalent qualification in medicine, nursing, an allied health profession, science or social science; and • at least 6 months of documented relevant professional work experience; and • current employment in a relevant field such as medicine, nursing or allied health; and • current eligible full member of ARCS Australia Ltd. Meeting these requirements does not guarantee selection. 2. In ranking and/or assessing applications, the Selection Committee will consider: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • prior academic qualification and performance; and • the professional experience. 3. The Selection Committee may seek further information to clarify any aspect of an application in accordance with the Academic Board rules (http://about.unimelb.edu.au/academicboard/resolutions) on the use of selection instruments. 4. Applicants are required to satisfy the university's English language requirements for postgraduate courses. For those applicants seeking to meet these requirements by one 											

	of the standard tests approved by the Academic Board, performance band 6.5 (http://about.unimelb.edu.au/academicboard/resolutions) is required.
