<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This subject is intended to focus on texts from non-mainstream literature as a stimulus to discussion and conversation practice. Advanced exercises in Italian composition will be set for the purpose of studying syntax and style in the appropriate registers. The subject will also include advanced take-home exercises in composition and translation with the purpose of refining syntax and style. Each student will present an assessable class paper on a topic to be negotiated with the lecturer at the beginning of the semester.						
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>On successful completion of this subject, students should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># have developed their written and spoken Italian, refining syntax and style;</li> <li># be able to discuss in Italian topics of a high level of complexity;</li> <li># be able to carry out analysis of texts.</li> </ul>						
<b>Assessment:</b>	<p>Written work consisting of two assignments of 500 words each (20%) (due during semester), An oral presentation of a class paper equivalent to 1000 words (commencing at the beginning of semester and due at the end of semester) (20%) an oral end of semester test equivalent to 1000 words (20%) Written exam of 2000 words at the end of semester (40%) This subject has the following hurdle requirements: Regular participation in tutorials is required with a minimum of 75% attendance. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day and in-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked.</p>
