Subject Overview:	This subject has the following components: Comprehensive oral health examination and treatment planning for adults, management of the older adult, periodontology, prosthodontics and cariology. It will be conducted as didactic component and using virtual clinical case based teaching. This subject continues alongside subjects Oral Health Sciences 4 and Oral Health Practice 4 . Teaching and learning activities will be centered at the Melbourne Dental School with support via the computer aided learning management system.
